General Membership Meeting April 11, 2006 – 6:15 PM

Minutes: Minutes of the March 14 meeting were changed to reflect Larry Johnson, not Larry Hall presented the Treasurer's Report. The corrected minutes were properly approved (motion – Rizzo; second – Hudson).

Treasurer's Report – Larry Johnson presented the January, February, and March Treasurer's Report:

- January reported (\$981.11) in 2005 adjustments and a monthly gain of \$188.36
- February reported a monthly gain of \$2,575.47
- March reported a monthly gain of \$1,806.83
- The ending bank balance reconciled to \$22,120.06 as of March 31, 2006

Beth Stenberg and Larry Johnson reviewed the 2005 transactions and support the (\$981.11) adjustment. The reports were properly approved (motion – Johnson; second – Marsili)

Newsletter: Nicholas Coleff reported the March/April newsletter was mailed timely and the quality was much better than it had been. All entries for the May/June newsletter are due to Nicholas by April 19, 2006.

Activity: Helen Blake distributed the 2006 schedule for the 50/50 Sales Assignment. Each board member is assigned on a rotation basis.

Nicholas will print a membership roster to be used at the Derby Dance on April 29.

Membership: Tommy Radcliffe was not at the meeting so the monthly report will be given next month. Nicholas reported he would like to handle the responsibility of the membership sales since he is already keeping the membership roster for the newsletter. As of 2/28/06 the membership count was 310 according to the list printed by Nicholas.

Music: No music purchased in February. Pam Hudson reported Jim Brown requested the board to change the music committee authority from \$50/month to \$600/year. After a brief discussion of the music library, no vote was taken to change the authority. Pam

Hudson reported to the Board the music library is in the possession of Jim Brown and she would ask him to prepare an inventory. The inventory is to be kept current including purchase amounts in the future.

Boogie in the Bluegrass III – In Mike Hall's absence Pam Hudson reported there would be a meeting April 19 at the Clarion. She also reported one new vendor has been added.

Old business: Pam Hudson reported the inventory has not been performed at the storage unit, but she has moved the decorations from her house to the storage unit.

From the Board's approval in March, Mike Hall took \$250 to the Smokey Mountain Shagger's Dance for our club's donation. It was suggested whenever we make a donation, a sign be taken to be placed at the dance announcing the donation.

Pam Hudson brought a donation request from Family & Children First, Inc. a child advocacy non-profit organization. The Board approved a donation of \$500 (motion Marsili; second – Nay)

New Business: Pam Hudson reported Glenn Moody is in Southern Indiana Rehabilitation Center, Blackiston Mill Road, Room 119 and recovering from the stroke. She sent a cookie bouquet today from the Club. Glenn is ready for visitors.
